# Construction has begun!

We are pleased to announce that Westhoek Construction Limited, of Chatham, was awarded the construction contract for our community's 10-bed residential hospice. Westhoek Construction will work closely with ROA Studio Inc., of Chatham, the project's architecture firm. Construction began in early April with completion targeted for the end of 2015.

The Construction Launch was recognized at an event on Friday, April 17th. During the construction of the 10-bed residential hospice, the community is encouraged to visit the site (corner of Wellington & Adelaide St., in Chatham) and tie a ribbon on the construction fence in memory or in honour of a loved one. Ribbons will be available at the site, at the St. Andrew's Residence Front Desk or feel free to bring your own.

## Hospice Heart Stories

Cilla Smith, from Pain Court, comes from a large family of six children all married with children of their own. When their mom, Anne, was diagnosed with a brain tumour, the family took turns caring for her so her wish to die at home could be fulfilled. Part of that care included utilizing the outpatient services made available through the St. Joseph's Hospice, in Sarnia.

"At first mom was hesitant, but after several visits where she had the chance to get to know the staff and volunteers and benefit from the services, she became more comfortable," said Cilla.

When it became clear that she could no longer be cared for at home, the earlier visits to the local hospice made the decision to move there much easier. "After Mom moved into the hospice, it didn't take us long to realize it was the right decision. Mom was made more comfortable and we all felt the burden of care lifted from our shoulders," shared Cilla.

Cilla and her family found that their large family felt very welcome at the hospice. Someone always stayed overnight with their mom and staff and volunteers were available 24 hours a day to answer their questions, help them understand the process of dying and, most of all, treat their mom with the best care possible as she lived out her final days.

"They were available to give her a bath or meet any other request at any time, day or night," said Cilla. "This not only helped my mom, but it helped the whole family with the grieving process. It also helped preserve our family relationships because being a caregiver is stressful. When Mom moved to the hospice, we could just focus on being her son, daughter or grandchild and it really made those last few weeks a treasure."

Cilla was so impressed with the care her mom received that she has signed up to be a volunteer at Chatham-Kent Hospice once it opens.

We made it! Spring is finally here! Winter this year seemed longer and colder than most - especially since our hospice team is in a big hurry to get the frost out of the ground and the new hospice building up and open. Chatham-Kent Hospice is delighted to partner with architects ROA Studio Inc. and contractor Westhoek Construction Limited to build our beautiful new hospice. So much care and thought has gone into the design and we owe a big thank you to our sister hospices who have shared their long list of "dos and don'ts" in design - all information gathered so carefully and lovingly by Director of Hospice Services Michelle O'Rourke - thank you!

Michelle and her team have also spent many hours choosing the furniture and equipment for our new hospice. We have learned much about what is needed to keep our most vulnerable members of the community safe. Materials need to be able to withstand the strong chemicals needed for infection control and furniture needs to be easily cleanable - no nooks and crannies that can harbour germs. Equally important - the furniture needs to be comfortable, as anyone who has held vigils with loved ones will know - hard seats become harder in the wee hours of the night. Finally, it is essential that our new hospice furniture is home like - home is where the heart is and at the Chatham-Kent Hospice, everything is about the heart.

I am excited about the launch of the Hospice Hope Chest because it will give the people of Chatham-Kent the opportunity to fill the hospice with items chosen with both our hearts and our minds.
